

1 Introduction

E.S.H. Da Vinci hands out score pins with a complementary certificate to members who have shot a promising score. There are score pins for 7, 8, 8.5, 9, and 9.5 score. The score pins look as follows:



2 Conditions

If a competition is suitable for scoring an score pin, depends on several factors:

- The competition is shot according to the official WA rules. These can be found via <https://worldarchery.org/rulebook>.
- The competition consists of at least 30 arrows. When a FITA is shot, the 60 arrows will be seen as two individual series of 30 arrows.
- The competitions is not a fun-match or a training.
- The score is checked with someone else than the archer itself.
- There is a referee who can judge if the score is counted fairly.
- A few examples of competitions where one can score an score pin are:
 - Koningsschieten
 - The Ladder competition
 - Indoor regional competition
 - NHB A-status indoor competitions
 - Beginners competition of Da Vinci
 - Koningen der Koningen from OGIO.

If you are not sure the competition will be valid, the board will judge if it is.



3 Request

If a member wants to request an score pin, the following conditions have to apply:

- A member has to have shot an score which is applicable for an score pin.
- The score of the score is exactly equal or higher than the score on the pin.
- A member has right on all score pins equal to or lower than the scored score.
- A member may receive an score pin only once. There are no costs for the pins.
- When the pins are lost or broken, a member can buy a new one for €5,- when showing the certificate.
